

Thematic Afternoon Program

Session I (June 5-16): Science Fiction and Fantasy

Explore and create new worlds in this exciting, creative session. What is science fiction? What is fantasy? What's the difference between science fiction and fantasy? Session III (July 3-14): Farm to Table

The old saying goes, "you are what you eat", but how does what we eat affect our daily lives? What are the ingredients in your favorite foods, snacks and drinks? How do these ingredients affect your body? Where do the ingredients of your favorite foods, snacks and drinks come from? How long does it take to get to you? What is the difference between fresh food, frozen food, or preserved food? How are our favorite fruits & vegetables grown? What does the farm to table movement teach us about sustainability?

Session IV (July 17-Aug. 4): Sailing the High Seas

Let's build boats and have fun racing them! This exciting theme will explore the science, history, and mythology of sailing throughout the ages. When were the first ocean faring vessels invented and by whom? What is the history of how we have used sailing vessels throughout the years? What are some of the most famous ships? What are major inventions in maritime technology? What are the navigation instruments? What materials are used to make a boat/ship? What is the engineering behind boat building? How can I make my boat go faster, hold more weight, or be safer for the people on it? What is life like as a sailor? What are some of the legends surrounding the seas and ocean travel from different cultures? Are pirates real? Are
