I am a doting wife and a mom of two wonderful children. During our free time, we enjoy traveling as a family. This is my 3rd year here at Arborland and my 31st year of being a Montessori teacher.

My goal is to provide a carefully planned, stimulating environment which will help children to develop within themselves the foundational habits, attitudes, skills and ideas essential for a lifetime of creative thinking and learning. Respect and courtesy are the foundations for everything we do, from which each child will soon learn the following important skills:

- how to put their work away where they found it
- how to tidy up after themselves
- the importance of helping a friend in need
- the importance of respecting the materials, the teachers and each other
- how to direct themselves and find their own 'work'
- and most importantly, how to be independent!

Each child will feel empowered to learn how great it feels to do things on their own! I am here to nurture, support and guide them every day and I am committed to making your child's Montessori experience productive, stimulating and fun! It is my mission to instill a love of learning so that they may grow up and develop a desire to become life-long learners.

As my partner with this academic journey may I ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready for the day's learning experience
- Complete all homework assignments
- Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve vocabulary and comprehension
- Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life
- Lastly, but most importantly, know that you expect him/her to succeed in school.

8:30-11:30 Three-Hour Work Period (Morning Montessori Learning Time)

11:30-12:00 Class Meeting/Whole Class Lesson Presentation

12:00-12:30 Lunch Time

12:30-1:00 Play Time

1:00-3:00 Afternoon Montessori Learning Time

Snack

A daily snack time for 10 minutes is available for your child. Please send a small nutritious snack such as granola bar, fruit, crackers, juice, etc. Please help us by reminding your child that he/she may not have chips for snacks. Please be advised that candy, gum, chocolates, and soda are not allowed in school. Sharing of food is also discouraged. Microwave is not available during snack time.

Homework

Contrary to popular belief, Montessori children do have homework. Montessori education is continuous. Therefore, it is important that children have continued opportunity in their own home to assume responsibility, accept the natural consequences, manage time and choose activities wisely. Their homework packet is given every Friday, so you may plan and schedule your child's other activities. Please remember, children learn by doing. They need to participate actively in all areas of life and living. They are physically tough, gregarious and quite capable of responsibility.

Lunch

For children who bring lunch from home, a microwave is available in the classroom to warm meals (not for cooking!). If you want your child to have instant noodles/macaroni and cheese for lunch, please cook it at home and place it in a microwavable safe container; we will be happy to assist your child to warm it up in school.

Laptop

Part of our technology implementation will include having the students use technology devices on a regular basis throughout the school year. We highly encourage all the students to bring their own personal laptop. Their laptops will be used as an academic learning tool only. No nonacademic games will be allowed at any time on school campus.
